



This guide is a collaboration between Idaho Falls Power and Tight Line Media. Tight Line Media is a multi-media production company founded & operated by outdoor journalist Kris Millgate. Kris, through her years of living, working, and playing on the river, developed the content for the guide so other paddlers could enjoy this stretch of the Snake River.

Idaho Falls Power (IFP) is a division of the City of Idaho Falls. As the oldest utility in Idaho, IFP has operated hydroelectric projects on this stretch of the Snake River since 1900. IFP manages the four

hydropower dams on this stretch of river consisting of: Upper, City, Lower and Gem State. This clean, renewable resource enables Idaho Falls Power to offer some of the lowest electric rates in the nation. The utility and city maintain numerous parks, boat ramps and other associated recreational facilities along the river.

Recommended float season is April-May before spring runoff and September-October before winter freeze. The Snake River is swift, cold, deep water. Conditions change daily so check flow levels at



www.usgs.gov and always recreate within your safe abilities and skill level.

This guide provides basic and general information on floating the river, it does not identify all or even most of the potential hazards that can be encountered. It is your responsibility to keep yourself and the people with you safe. Before entering the river, know your limits and follow river safety precautions. **Always wear a life preserver.**

Warning! There is no way through the dams on the Snake River.

Exit the river upstream of each dam.



North of Idaho Falls city center running along Freeman Park between Upper Dam and City Dam

Level: Advanced Length: 3.5 miles

Enter: River left rock channel below Upper Dam

TOWN HAUL

Idaho Falls city center upper stretch between City Dam and Lower Dam

Level:

Advanced

Length:

1 mile - accessible only in low water conditions

Enter:

River right rock ledge under viewing deck below City Dam waterfalls

- Walk-in access via steep, rock outcropping
- · Paved parking lot
- · Picnic tables
- Bathroom

Exit:

River right Rock Gardens at Taylor's Crossing

- · Walk-out access via rock-flower landscaped area with grass trail
- · Paved parking lot
- Picnic tables

Hazards:

- Midriver City Dam above entry point
- Midriver waterfall turbulence at and below entry point
- · Overhead Broadway

bridge, walking bridge and railroad bridge below entry point

River left diversion channel below railroad bridge

- Highlights: River left famous Idaho Falls waterfalls at and below entry point
 - River left Japanese Friendship Garden below Broadway bridge
 - River left Idaho Falls Power headquarters below railroad bridge
 - River right Rock Gardens at Taylor's Crossing below IFP headquarters

Idaho Falls city center lower stretch between City Dam and Lower Dam



Level: Intermediate Length: 1.5 miles

Enter: River right Heritage Park walk-in access via border of park and river

GEM RUN

Southern stretch of Bonneville County above Gem State Dam ending near Bingham County border.

Level: Length:

Beginner 2 miles

Enter:

River left Upper Gem Lake Marina at 49th South

- Boat ramp
- · Gravel parking lot
- Picnic tables
- Floating docks
- Beach
- Bathroom

Exit:

River right Lower Gem Lake Marina above Gem State

Dam

- Boat ramp
- Gravel parking lot
- Picnic tables
- Floating docks
- Bathroom

Hazards:

- Midriver islands
- Midriver Highway 26 bridge concrete pillars one mile below entry point
- Midriver Highway 26 bridge low clearance for boats but clearance for paddlers
- · Midriver Gem State Dam below exit point

Highlights: • Lava rock banks on both sides of channel above exit point
